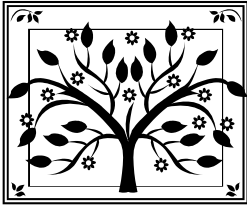


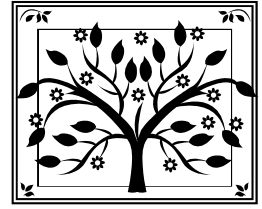

## Perennials & Bulbs

1. **Thrift**, *Armeria*, Bloodstone - Abundant long-blooming flowers, salt tolerant; adapts well to poor, dry soil. Evergreen tufted foliage keeps this plant interesting year round. Ht 36" Blooms late Spring-Summer, **plug \$7**
2. **Black-Eyed Susan**, *Rudbeckia*, Goldstrom - Black coned seed heads provide winter interest, Long-lasting blooms. Excellent cut flower. Ht 24-30", Blooms Mid-Summer-Early Fall, **plug \$4**
3. **Bitterroot**, *Lewisia*, Little Plum - Lance-shaped leaves. Abundant rose purple flowers with a touch of orange. Good in containers, alpine gardens & adorning crevices of retaining walls. Requires good drainage. Ht 6-9", Blooms Late Spring-Early Fall, **plug \$6**
4. **Jacob's Ladder**, *Polemonium*, Snow & Sapphires - Clean, dark green foliage with crisp white border. Masses of sky blue flowers. Easily grown in sun to part shade. Ht 24-30" Bloom - Late spring to early summer, **plug \$5**
5. **Balloon Flower**, *Platycondon*, Mariesii - Striking Star-shaped blue flower & unusual balloon-shaped buds are excellent cut for bouquets. Remove faded flowers for best reblooming. New growth emerges late spring. Ht 4-6" Blooms Throughout Summer, **plug \$4**
6. **Meadow Sage**, *Savlia*, May Night - Long lasting blooms, great cut flowers, fresh or dried, Ht 24-30", Blooms Early-Mid Summer, **plug \$4**
7. **Sandwort**, *Arenaria*, Montana - 1" flowers provide a long season of color. Evergreen foliage forms a low-growing mat of foliage. Ht 4-6", Blooms Mid-Late Spring, **plug \$5**
8. **Butterflyweed**, *Asclepias*, Gay Butterfly - Delightful mix of long lasting varying shades of orange flower heads that provide shimmering color. Ht 18-24" Blooms Late Summer, **plug \$5**
9. **Pinks**, *Dianthus*, Firewitch - Fragrant, deep-pink flowers produce a spice-clove aroma. Blue-green evergreen foliage. Ht 6" Blooms Mid-Late Summer, **plug \$4**
10. **Foxglove**, *Digitalis mertonensis* - Beautiful shades of pink to copper bell-shaped flowers. Ht 24-36" Blooms Early-Mid Summer, **plug \$4**
11. **Coneflower**, *Echinacea*, Magnus - Beautiful rose-pink petals w/orange-brown center cone. Drought Tolerant, Ht 28-36" Blooms Mid-Summer - Fall, **plug \$4**
12. **Blanket Flower**, *Gaillardia*, Goblin - Large red flowers w/yellow edges. Low, compact variety. Ht 8-12" Blooms Early Summer - Fall, **plug \$4**
13. **Lavender**, *Provence* - One of the best culinary lavenders! Large vigorous shrub. Long-lasting blooms have sweet intense fragrance, Ht 36-48", Blooms All Summer into Fall, **plugs \$5**

## Ornamental Grasses

14. **Feather Reed Grass** - Perfect grass for the back border. Feathery blooms stand perfectly straight. Seeds are sterile Ht 5-6' Blooms early Summer, **plug \$6**
15. **Sedge**, *Evergold* - Narrow, arching dark-green leaves w/a broad creamy yellow center stripe, Ht 12" Blooms Late Spring, **plug \$6**
16. **Blue Lyme Grass** - Beautiful bright-blue blades that push upwards & outward. Very tough plant, heat & salt tolerant, Ht 24-30" Blooms Summer, **plug \$10**
17. **Maiden Grass**, *Huron Sunrise* - Medium-green foliage w/natural silver lines. Plumes open w/burgundy color & are excellent cut or dried. Ht 5' Blooms Late Summer, **plug \$6**

## Ground Covers & Vines

18. **Lady's Mantle**, *Alchemilla*, Thriller - Compact, ground-hugging plant. Tiny star-shaped clusters of yellow-green flowers, Ht 20" Blooms Late Spring-Early Summer, **plug \$4**
19. **Bellflower**, *Campanula*, Pantaloons - Unique semi-double hose in hose purple-pink flower. Deep green heart shaped leaves. Tolerates part shade. Excellent ground cover, Ht 2-3" Blooms Mid-Summer, **plug \$8**
20. **Broadmoor Juniper** - Soft Grayish-green foliage has dense growth habit Good color year round, Ht 2-3' Spread to 10', **pot \$3**
21. **Wisteria**, Blue Moon - Large, showy lilac-blue flowers held in foot-long racemens like clusters of grapes. Sweet, intense fragrance. Blooms 3 times every year. 25ft., **4" plug \$10**
22. **Scarlet Trumpet Honeysuckle** - Extremely cold-hardy & virtually ever blooming. Long-tubed, brilliant scarlet flowers that cover the vine, Ht 8-12" Blooms early Summer, **3" pot \$8**

## Evergreens & Hardwoods

23. **American Arborvitae** - natural choice for windbreaks, landscaping. 2 yr. 6-8", **bareroot 25/\$35**
24. **Balsam Fir** - The original, old fashion Christmas trees, fragrant. 3 yr. 12-16", **bareroot 5/\$30**
25. **Norway Spruce** - - fastest growing of the spruces, dark green needles. 2yr. 10-14", **bareroot 25/\$35**
26. **White Pine** - - fast growing, great for Christmas trees 2yr. 8-12", **bareroot 5/\$10**
27. **Canadian Hemlock** - lacy, dark evergreen foliage, great for landscaping, **4yr 8-18" pot \$5**

## Ornamental Trees & Shrubs

28. Azalea – Girard Pleasant, large white flowers, *pot \$16*
29. Azalea – Tradition, pink flowers, *pot \$16*
30. Butterfly Bush – Adonis Blue, compact, deep blue flowers, *pot \$16*
31. Butterfly Bush – Purple Emperor, compact, mauve-purple flowers, *pot \$16*
32. Flowering Quince – Cameo, apricot-pink flowers, *pot \$14*
33. Flowering Quince – Crimson & Gold, large crimson flowers with gold center, *pot \$14*
34. Rose of Sharon – Lavender Chiffon, large single lavender flowers with lacy center, *pot \$16*
35. Rose of Sharon – White Chiffon, large single white flowers with lacy centers, *pot \$16*
36. Hydrangea – Claudie, rich pink-blue lacecaps, *pot \$20*
37. Hydrangea – large double pink-blue mophead, *pot \$20*
38. Holly – Castle Spire, compact, pyramidal red fruit, *pot \$16*
39. Holly – Castle Wall, male pollinator for Castle Spire, *pot \$16*
40. Spirea – Anthony Waterer, Deep rose red flowers, *pot \$14*
41. Spirea – Shirobana, pink & white flowers on same plant! *pot \$14*
42. Weigela – Wine & Roses, dark burgundy-purple foliage, deep pink flowers, *pot \$16*
43. Eastern Redcedar\* Medium green needles Flat & scale-like Exfoliating handsome grayish to reddish-brown bark is considered part of it ornamental interest. Should grow in almost any soil and does well in poor gravelly soil, Ht 40-50ft Spread 8-20ft. 3yr 10-18" bareroot *\$4*
44. Green Ash\* -Fast growing, Grows best in well drained soil, Once established will thrive in dry, sterile soil. Ht 60ft. *pot \$6*
45. American Elderberry\* - Vigorous fast growing shrub to 10 feet in height. Spread 6 to 8 feet. Needs plenty of room to grow. Grown for its clusters of bluish-black berries, late summer. Any type of soil. Wetland tolerant. 2yr, 1-3ft, bareroot *\$10*
46. Red Mulberry - Fast growing, broad spreading crown growing to a height of 30-50' spreading 20-40'. Large eye-catching 3-5" dark green leaves, Bark is dark gray-brown. 3 yr 1-2' 3-4yrs, *pot \$6*
47. Northern Bayberry\* - Lustrous, deep green foliage is semi-evergreen. Very aromatic when crushed. A very ornamental shrub, growing 5 to 12 feet height and spread. Noted for its waxy-gray berries from which candles are made. Grows in poor, sandy soil. bareroot 1 yr, 4-9" 5 for *\$15*
48. Rugosa Rose\* - Hardy, reddish-pink blooms in summer, red fruit in fall, excellent erosion control 2 yr 6-12" Bareroot 1 yr, 4-9" 5 for *\$15*
49. Beach Plum\* - Good on sand dunes or for screens & edges, edible fruit used for jelly, white blooms. 1 yr 6-10" Bareroot 1 yr, 4-9" 5 for *\$15*

50. Blueberry - late – Jersey *\$10*
51. Blueberry - mid – Blueray *\$10*
52. Blueberry - early – Patriot *\$10*
53. Asparagus - Jersey Supreme - high yields, disease resistant, one yr. crowns, **bundle of 25 / \$10**

54. Strawberries - Allstar - large berries with superb quality and flavor, late mid-season **bundle of 25 / \$10**
55. Raspberries - Heritage- high quality fruit, the most popular everbearing variety. Summer crop in early July, fall crop from the end of August through October **bundle of 25 / \$30**

## Coastal Plants

56. "CAPE" AMERICAN BEACH GRASS  
Easy to plant and spreads rapidly. Plant 2-3 culms 18" apart, before April 15th for best results. American Beachgrass is the most effective way to stabilize dunes and areas of shifting sand in coastal areas. Please check with your town conservation commission before planting beachgrass along coastal areas. Due to the lateness of our Pick-up Day, beachgrass may be ordered and picked up at the West Wareham office. **Deadline to order is March 21st.** Pick-up will be March 24<sup>th</sup>-28<sup>th</sup> & March 31<sup>st</sup> - April 4<sup>th</sup>. We will not have any at the Pick-up on April 26<sup>th</sup>-27<sup>th</sup>. **Bundle of 300 / \$35**

## Plymouth County Conservation District

Each year since 1970, the PCCD has sponsored a *Tree, Shrub and Plant Sale* to encourage planting for erosion control, wildlife food and cover, windbreaks, and beautification. The proceeds from our annual sale support the District's Conservation Programs. The District, in cooperation with the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service offers free technical assistance to land owners in Plymouth County. Individuals are assisted with conservation plans for land use; in particular, erosion control, forest management, wildlife habitat enhancement and farm resource management. Issues such as water quality, water conservation and waste disposal require great attention. The District helps individuals and communities by sponsoring workshops and conferences for leaders and landowners relating to soil, water and other important natural resources.

The District is managed by a seven member elected volunteer board, headed by Chairman, Kim LaFluer & Supervisors Joe Freitas, Bob Lessard, Dick Ward, Gary Randall, Mike Baptiste and Doug Schneider. We are always looking for a few interested people to serve as supervisors and non-voting associate supervisors. Meetings are the second Wednesday of the month at the West Wareham Office.

**VOLUNTEERS** - We are always looking for people to help with packing, labeling and distributing during the week before and weekend of the Sale.
